## THE HEART of the FREEDOM TRAIL

April-November: 1:00 pm Saturday

## REINVENTING BOSTON: A CITY ENGINEERED

From creating land, building America's first subway, to the Big Dig, Boston has a long tradition of changing its cityscape. Find forgotten streets and waterways and discover awe-inspiring infrastructure on this walk through the history of a city transformed.

Meet your guide at the corner of Tremont and Court Streets, in front of the Steaming Kettle. GPS: 63 Court Street, Boston, MA 02108

## THE HUB OF LITERARY AMERICA

Our literary stroll highlights the homes and haunts of 19th century writers such as Thoreau, Alcott, Longfellow and Poe. Their work collectively made Boston the literary center of America.

## THE NORTH END: GATEWAY TO BOSTON

Boston's oldest neighborhood is a delightful labyrinth of narrow streets and interesting marketplaces. A gateway for immigrants from around the world, it is also home to the Old North Church and the Paul Revere House. Meet your guide at the corner of Hanover and Cross Streets, in front of the Tony DeMarco boxer statue. GPS: 200 Hanover Street, Boston, MA 02113

## BEACON HILL

2:00 pm Saturday & Sunday

From the golden dome of the State House to the elegant homes of Louisburg Square, this tour offers examples of the work of Charles Bulfinch and his followers. By daylight or by twilight, *The Hill* casts a spell of enchantment. *No tour October 31*

Meet your guide at the bottom of the State House steps on Beacon Street across from the Common. GPS: 24 Beacon Street, Boston, MA 02108
